

# Finding eBooks

Search for electronic books in the Primo library catalogue on the main library web site, [library.wlu.ca](http://library.wlu.ca). Type your search in the search box in the middle of the page. I'll search for books on Canadian media. Primo searches for books and articles, so you'll see both in the results. To see just books, click on the Books + tab at the top of the search box.

In the left menu, you'll see options for limiting your results.

Under Show Only, there is an *Online resource* option. This only shows up if there are online books on the topic you searched for, so you might not see it every time. If you do see it, click on the *Online resources* link to see only the e-books.

Then, look in the left menu again under Library, and click on Wilfrid Laurier University to see the eBooks we have access to at Laurier. You'll now see books that are online and available to the Laurier community.

Click on the title of the book to see the full text. If you're off campus, you'll be asked to sign in using your network login.

The Library has a few different types of eBook. In some cases, you'll see the information about the book and will need to click on a button to borrow it. You might need to create a free Adobe Digital Editions account before you can download and read the book. For some books, you can then read books on different computers and devices.

For other types of eBook, you can read it online without an account, or download it with an Adobe Digital Editions account.

Most eBooks allow you to print or copy only a portion of the book, which you'll see on the book page. If you download a book, you'll get it for typically 1 or 3 days, depending on what's listed on the book page.
