 - 1. Welcome and Introductions

Gohar welcomed everyone to the meeting and provided a brief overview of the agenda. She thanked everyone who has contributed feedback to the two new Library building projects (Waterloo and Brantford)

- 2. Approval of the agenda
 - Approved by consensus
- 3. Approval of the minutes from January 11, 2017
 - Motion: Gohar moved to approve the minutes. Seconded by Matt Tales. Carried.
- 4. Business arising from the minutes

- 5. Waterloo Library Learning Commons (LLC), Draft Report Gohar

Guest: Peter Thomson, Project Coordinator, Renovation & Construction

- The new Library Learning Commons will be roughly the same size (square footage) as the current Library, only slightly larger
- It will be located where the current Solarium is, between the Paul Martin centre and Concourse area; the parking lot behind the dining hall will be removed to accommodate the Library Learning Commons
- Plans include enhancing the streetscape so that the Library is no longer just looking inward, but also inviting in those travelling down University Avenue

- There will be a bridge connecting the LLC to the Lazaridis Business building; it will be approximately 15 feet wide and will include some smaller meeting rooms and other spaces
- Several questions and comments related to use of space (study vs. meeting), size of café, accessibility of loading dock, location of the collection, design of entrances and shape of building; Peter and Gohar advised that all feedback would be considered
- 6. Brantford Library ECS Report Gohar

Guest: Gary Nower, AVP: Physical Resources

- A Laurier Library will be established in the current Market Square building located in downtown Brantford
- An architect from Toronto *Moriyama & Teshima* has been hired to complete the project
- Simon Fraser University also converted a mall into a Library, but Laurier's library will look different
- No preliminary drawings yet, but the report outlines what each space will be used for (classrooms, study areas, retail, food)
- The Library will feature an Automated Retrieval System (ARS) for storing and retrieving resources; this will help significantly with storing the collection
- Important aspects of the new building: large number of collaborative spaces, flexible space and innovative technology
- The Library will feature 2500 student seats, and compact shelving for 250,000 resources
- It was noted that delivery times for the exchange of resources between Brantford and Waterloo are not good right now; Gohar and Gary agreed that a more robust transferral service needs to be implemented
- Final Market Square floor plans will be available in June 2017
- 7. University Librarian Report
 - Gohar expressed how pleased she was that information about both new libraries has now been released to Library Council, and that the process is moving forward
 - Gohar advised that the Office of the Vice-President: Academic has asked for the Library to develop a long term vision report; a draft report is expected in May/June 2017; the Laurier community will be invited to provide feedback in October 2017
 - Question about whether new library plans and information are confidential; Gohar responded that the information is confidential until an official Communication Plan is implemented
 - There will be town halls in the future to elicit feedback on both new Library buildings from the Laurier community
