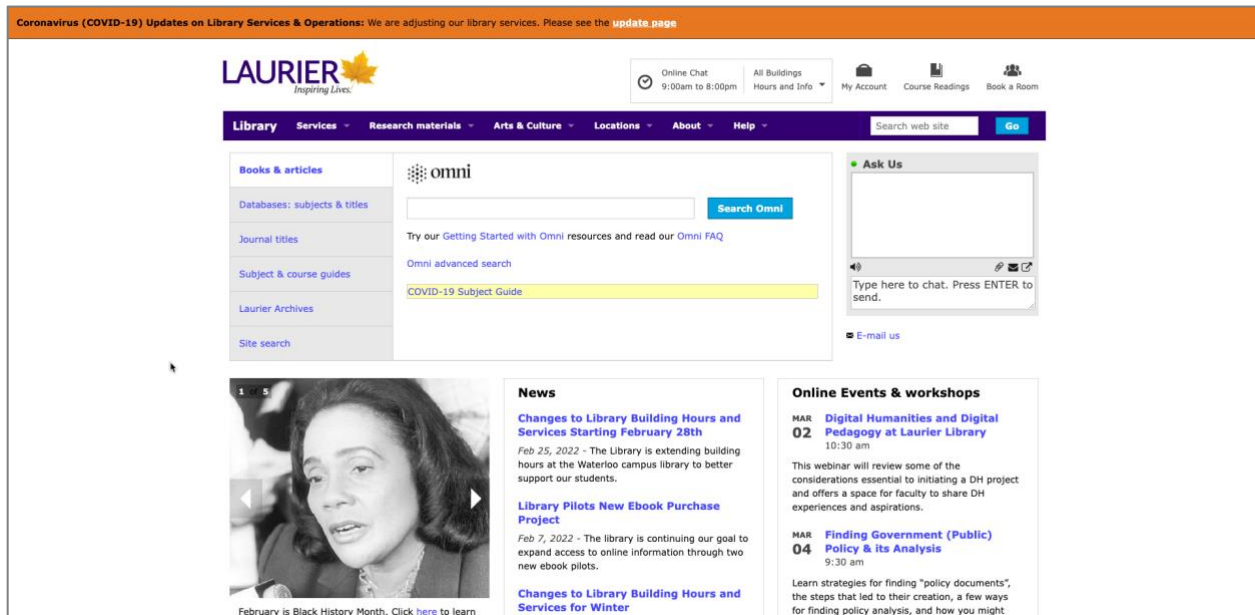
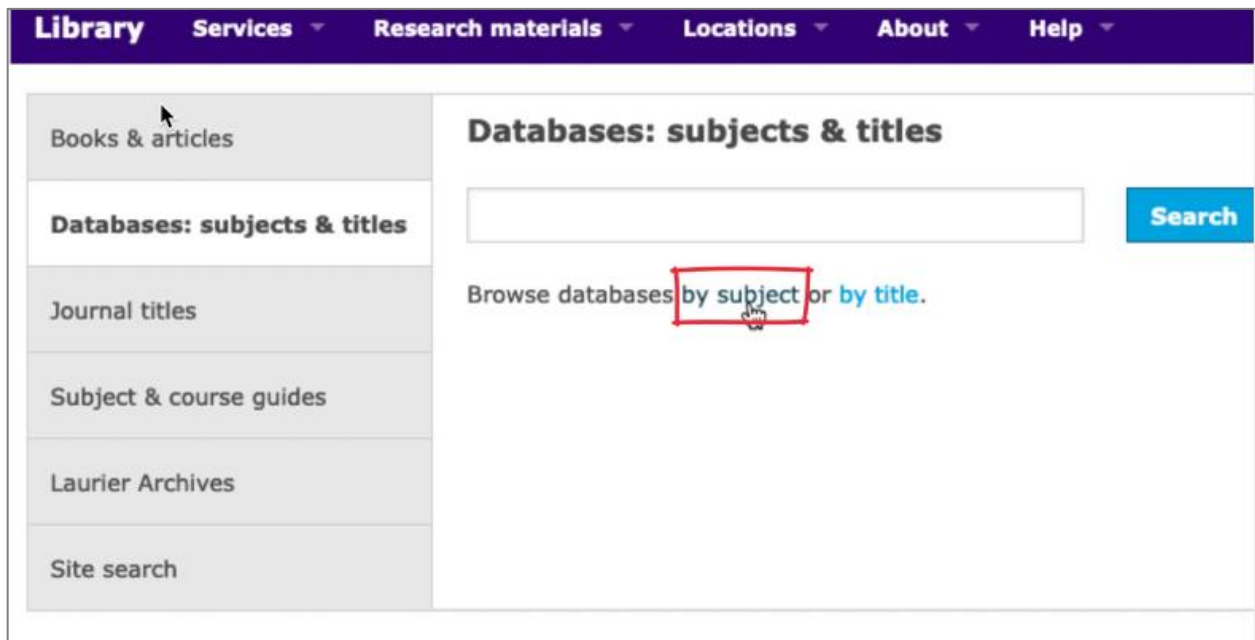


CS101 Video Tutorial 3: Updated Instructions

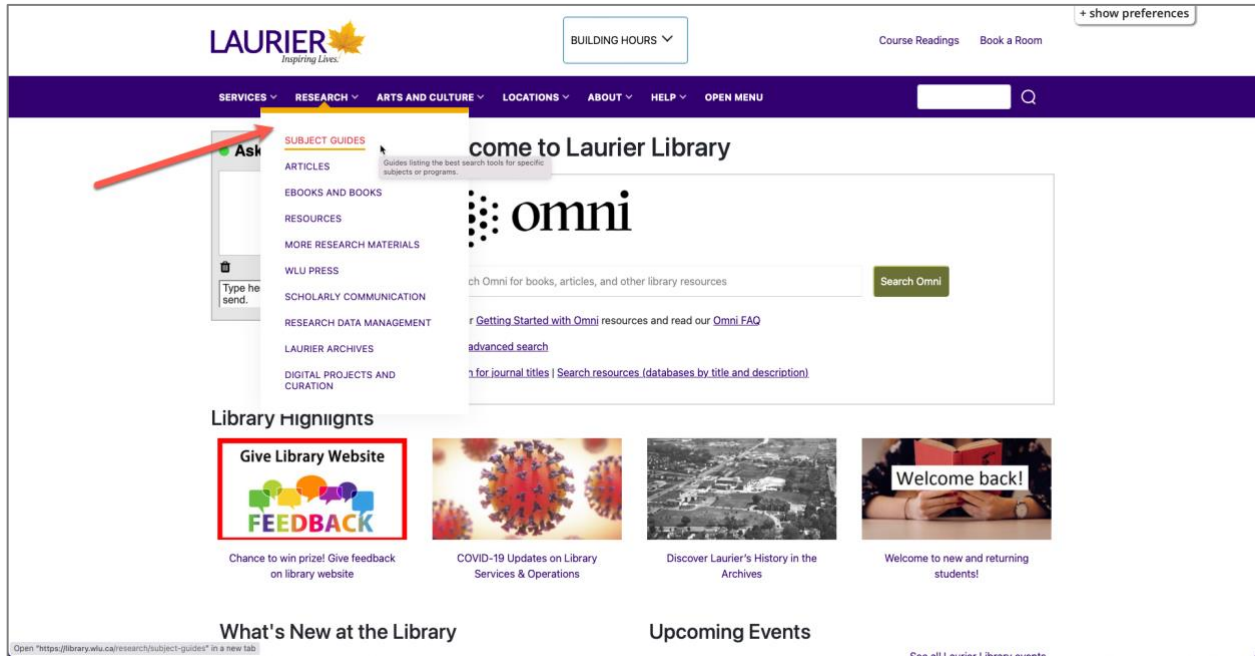
The video shows the old website homepage, which was updated at the end of August, 2022, as shown below.



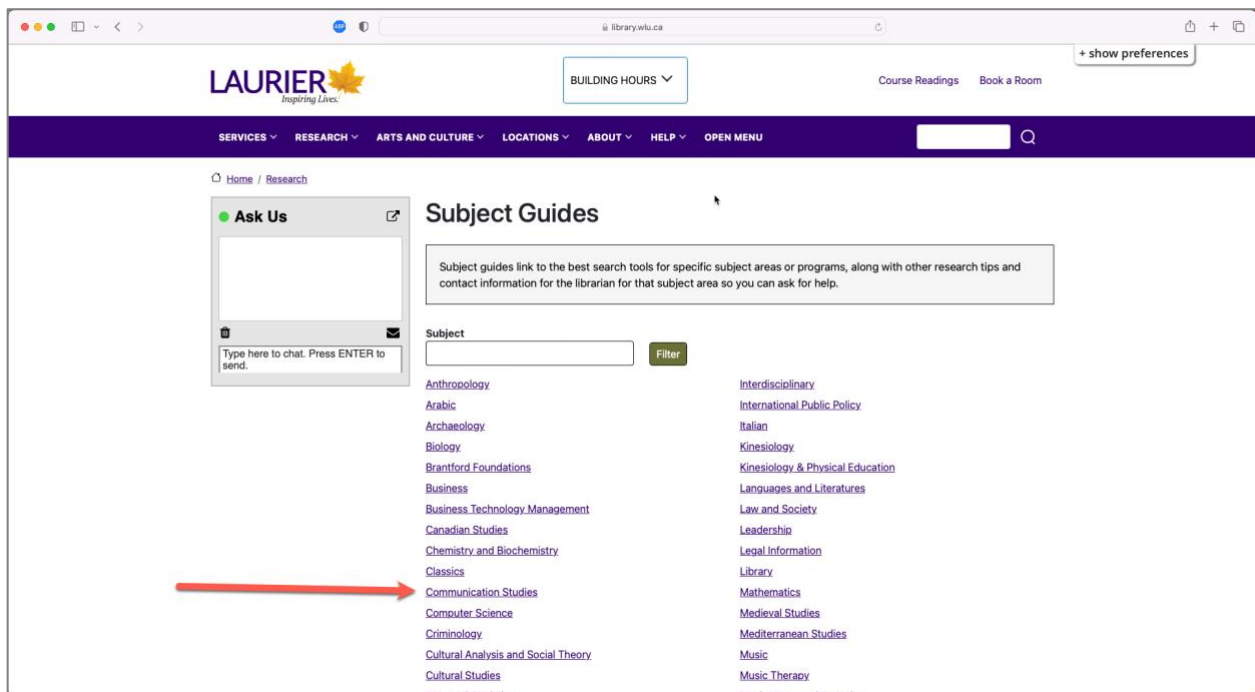
At 0:11, you are directed to the Communication Studies subject guide by clicking the Databases menu option, then browse database by subject, as shown in the graphics below.



The **new path** using our updated website is to start at the homepage, click the Research menu item in the top menu bar and select the Subject Guides menu item.



Next, click the link to the Communications Studies Guide on the subject page.



You'll then be on the Communication Studies Subject Guide.

The EBSCO database is the first one listed on the page.
