



Two book collections in the Brantford Public Library





Different types of information

Scholarly Articles

Scholarly articles often have most of the following:

- Abstract (a summary of the article)
- Introduction & literature review (summarizes studies already done)
- Methodology (the method used to conduct the study)
- Results (what the author found)
- Discussion/Conclusions (what the author concludes)
- Reference List (list of books and articles used)

Omni (Laurier Library Catalogue)



What you can find here:

- 1. Laurier books
- 2. Books from 18 Ontario university libraries (not just Laurier)
- 3. Online articles (from journals, magazines & news sources)
- 4. A chat box for instant help

Search in library catalogue (Omni)



Search for the **important words** in your topic.

For example:

Is climate change related to the frequency of wildfires?

Tips for using search words

- Experiment with different search words
 (for example: teenagers OR adolescents)
- Use a dictionary of similar words

(called a "thesaurus")

for example: Merriam Webster
