PICKING A TOPIC WORKSHEET

What to do	How to do it	Your ideas
 1. Choose a broad topic area e.g. social media in politics 	Pick either something covered in class which you want to know more about, OR a concept from class which you want to apply to a different topic	
2. Focus your topic e.g. politicians' use of Twitter during election campaigns	Identify possible sub-topics. Get ideas by brainstorming or doing a library search to see what people write about. Pick one be as specific as possible.	
3. Is your topic workable?	Do a search in the main search box at library.wlu.ca to make sure you can find enough scholarly sources (click on 'limit to peer-reviewed' in the results). No luck? Be sure to use different search terms before giving up, then go back to step 2 and try again.	
4. Is your topic the right size?	How many scholarly sources did you find in step 3? If more than 150, your topic is likely too broad. Go back to step 2 and narrow it. The shorter your paper is, the more specific your topic will need to be.	
5. Final topic	Your topic after steps 1-4. Important: this may change after you find & read your scholarly sources.	



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
