

FINDING COUNTRY RISK: NEXIS UNI

If you're looking for information on risk in other countries, Nexis Uni, formerly called Lexis Nexis Academic, is a database that can help you. In it you can find reports that cover politics, economic policies and trends, and the country's financial condition.

To find Nexis Uni, type the title in the Search Web Site box in the menu bar of the Laurier Library web site, then press Go. Click on the database title. Then click on Connect to Resource.

In Nexis Uni, look under Guided Search and click to select Country Info. Then, select your country from the dropdown menu. We'll choose Argentina. Next, look at the Choose Source dropdown. Choose Country Risk Overview to get a general picture of trends. Then click Search.

Here we get a number of reports on both political and economic risk, for different dates, created by the PRS Group. Click on the title to see the report.

PRS Group reports are considered credible and authoritative sources for your assignments. But in some cases, the report might be a few years old. You would still use it, but you might want more recent information to supplement it. In this case you can also view news articles on your country. These are less authoritative, but can be helpful to check if the situation is still the same as in an older PRS report.

In the left column, it specifies that we have narrowed by choosing to see Country Risk Overview. Click the x next to it to see all the available sources instead. You will now see many recent news articles on the political and economic situation in Argentina.
